Been sort of a dull week for us this past week, - so have spent my time useless as usual. Been into town about 3 times, mostly to get some ice cream at the Officer's Red Cross. Once we stayed in and ate supper, even! Just to get a change in our diet of "C" rations. We were going in today for supper, but the rain changed all of that. It's a good thing tho. for when I went by the cook's shack on way to shower I saw

them cutting up some fresh meat! Steaks it looked like! It would be a shame to miss the only fresh meat we've had in a couple of weeks, wouldn't it? - That, - I'll not do, believe me!

Just got thru reading the Sunday Post for Sept. 19th. - It just so happens that I opened it on a Sunday, but that makes it ~~kinda~~ nice. - The Sunday comics at least gives us an air of it being Sunday. That's about all we have ~~to~~ to designate it from the rest of the week. Spent about 3 hrs reading it. - Must have covered most everything in it including all the ads. The "picture" ads, I mean - not the classified ones. Don't know why I get such a bang out of 'em but I do. - The same way with magazines. He usually read them twice. First for the ads + the jokes, and then for the stories or articles - in just that order, too! Now my Post is making its rounds of the camp with the comics most popular, of course! What he's?

Ma, you should have seen me perform a major operation on a pair of my winter trousers yesterday! I've been talking about doing it for a long time, but yesterday I actually got down to doing it. When I dug them out to wear - I found the waist a couple of inches too big so decided to take it in.
