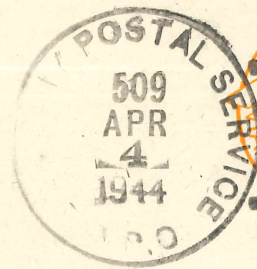
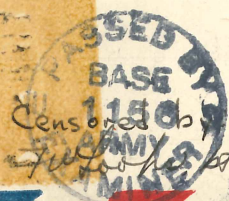

Here it is April again! - Just think, on the 17th it will start my second year of overseas duty! - Ha. - pretty soon I'll not only merit rotation as a flyer - I'll be able to put in for the 18mo. rotation that the ground personnel are supposedly entitled too! Only hope I have no more trouble in my second period of it than I had during the first, tho. - cause actually I've been a very, very fortunate lad in almost every way - and I'm not complaining a bit!

Today is a beautiful day - a perfect Palm Sunday. - It sure makes us want to get out and just walk & walk. - If I get enough ambition up - I might get out & fly! Nothing so strenuous as walking. Haven't flown in over a week now - Doc just

"ungrounded" me yesterday, so thought I might take a plane up - fly around a couple of hours and maybe shoot a landing or two! - Just to see if I can still do it! - Can you see me spending all day at Congressional and getting to fly maybe 15 minutes? - Never expected to be able to walk out, crank up ^{some} 4000 horses and take off - just because I got an urge to get myself airborne. In fact, I never expected to be sitting in Sardinia either, - so guess I could go on drawing odd pictures all day!
